SENATOR GREGORY LUNA LEGISLATIVE SCHOLARS AND FELLOWS PROGRAM

PROGRAM DATES | JAN 3, 2019 - MAY 30, 2019

The Senate Hispanic Research Council dedicates itself to strengthening the next generation of young leaders with this enriching Scholars and Fellows program. Participants in the Senator Gregory Luna Legislative Scholars and Fellows Program will gain invaluable experience and exposure to the Texas Senate as full-time legislative assistants during the 86th Legislative Session. Each participant is assigned to the office of a State Senator or the Lieutenant Governor to perform a variety of legislative tasks. Complementing the work experience, they will meet with local and state leaders for weekly sessions to discuss leadership development and public policies that shape the state. Scholars and Fellows will receive a monthly stipend to compensate for worked performed and to assist with living expenses.

LEGISLATIVE TASKS AND DUTIES

(Will include but not limited to)

- Draft legislative research summaries, bill analyses, floor statements, articles and press releases.
- Prepare floor packets for Senators.
- Track legislation.
- Attend policy meetings.
- Conduct meetings with lobbyists and advocacy groups.
- Perform policy research.
- Monitor committee hearings.
- Manage constituent relations.
- Handle inter-office communications.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Scholar: An undergraduate student enrolled in an accredited educational institution with at least 60 semester hours completed.
- Fellow: A graduate student currently enrolled in an accredited educational institution.
- Recent graduates are eligible to apply .
- All applicants must:
 - Be at least 21 years old by January 8, 2019.
 - Possess high academic achievement.
 - Demonstrate an interest in government and public policy through active participation in community service activities.
 - Possess exceptional writing, comprehension and analytical skills.
 - Display leadership qualities and potential for further growth.
 - Be prepared to provide legal proof of eligibility for employment.
 - Demonstrate cooperative abilities in a past project or accomplishment.
 - Understand the basic tenants of Texas government
 - Have an interest in government and public policy

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

All participants must:

- Understand that all program participants are considered full-time staff within their assigned offices.
- All program participants should expect to work beyond a typical 40-hour workweek, though responsibilities may vary from office to office.
- Attend program commencement orientation and weekly meetings held at 7:00 a.m.
- Attend scheduled weekend events and workshops.
- Participate in all SHRC sponsored activities.
- Collectively develop and implement a group community service project with fellow 2019 scholars and fellows.

CREDIT HOURS

Qualifying credit hours vary between academic institutions. Participants must contact their respective schools to determine how they can receive academic credit for this program.

2019 TAXES

According to IRS guidelines, you are responsible for paying taxes on the compensation you receive during your internship. As such, the income is subject to self-employment tax, therefore you will receive a 1099 MISC tax form in 2020.

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RÉSUMÉ

Submit a current résumé that lists your education information, employment history, community involvement, extracurricular activities and academic accomplishments.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

Applicants must describe the experiences or activities that led to their interest in government and the Senator Gregory Luna Legislative Scholars and Fellows Program. Successful applicants will focus on how those experiences contributed to their character and helped build the leadership qualities necessary for this internship. They should explain how they believe this legislative experience will enhance their future aspirations. The personal statement must be limited to three typed pages, 12-point font, double-spaced with one-inch margins.

WRITING SAMPLE

Applicants must draft a policy analysis on any issue affecting the State of Texas. They should include an introduction, background information, an analysis of the competing sides of the issue, policy recommendations and a summary. The writing sample must be limited to three typed pages, 12-point font, double-spaced with one-inch margins.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Applicants must include two letters of recommendation – one from a professor or an academic advisor, and one from a current or former employer – commending their qualifications for the Senator Gregory Luna Legislative Scholars and Fellows Program. The letters should provide the selection committee with thoughtful examples of the applicant's leadership experience and potential, community involvement, major strengths and weaknesses, areas for improvement and development, and a description of how he or she would benefit from this Program.

TRANSCRIPT

Applicants must provide one current, official college or university transcript in a sealed envelope from every institution attended.
